Seminar workshop "Shape the future with Generative UI"



On 16th and 17th January 2025, two career support sessions were conducted at Balmatta Campus by Mr. Abhishek K N, CEO of A and M Edu Solution. Final semester students from various specializations attended the sessions, which focused on using Al tools like ChatGPT for coding, content creation, analysis, and report generation. Organized in collaboration with the ABHIMAN Placement Cell, the sessions provided practical insights into digital career paths and skill development.

Microsoft SC 900



On 21st to 25th January 2025, a comprehensive training program on Microsoft SC 900 was conducted for BCA (AI & ML) Robotics students. The training focused on cybersecurity and ethical hacking, combining theoretical knowledge with hands-on practice. This approach provided students with a solid understanding of key concepts. Mr. Mohammed Sheikh Nihal served as the guest faculty for the sessions, guiding participants throughout the program.

Placement Drive "TALENT CONNECT"



On 27th January, "Talent Connect" organized a Technical Aptitude Test for BCA final-year students at the Balmatta campus, with a total of 357 students participating. Following the test, all students will proceed to the HR round, offering a valuable opportunity to experience live HR interactions on designated dates. The results of the aptitude test will be carefully reviewed together with the company to identify students who meet the company's hiring requirements. Furthermore, a special request has been made to the company to select at least 30 finalists from the pool of candidates for further consideration, ensuring a comprehensive and equitable shortlisting process that maximizes student opportunities and supports informed hiring decisions.

Introduction to Cybersecurity



On February 6 to 10, 2025, a four-day Microsoft training program on Cybersecurity was conducted for first-year BCA students, led by Mr. Mohammed Sheikh Nihal. The sessions covered crucial topics such as Introduction to Cybersecurity, Kali commands, Phases of Hacking, Data Vulnerability, Proxy Setup, Phishing, SQL Injection, and WiFi attacks. The workshop blended theory with handson practical sessions, using interactive methods and visual aids. With 58 participants, the training encouraged active student engagement and concluded with Q&A segments each day. The program helped students gain clarity about the field of Cybersecurity and inspired some to explore it further as a career path.

IBM ICE Day 2025



On February 10 to 11, 2025, the Department of Computer Science at YIASCM, in collaboration with IBM ICE, hosted IBM ICE Day 2025 at the Balmatta Campus. Aimed at bridging academia and industry,

the two-day tech event featured expert talks, workshops, and competitions focused on AI, cybersecurity, and data analytics. The event was inaugurated with speeches by Dr. Mani Madhukar and Mr. Viqaruddin Surki, who emphasized the importance of practical tech skills. Activities included 24-hour coding challenges (Tech Storm and Solvation), model-building, poster presentations, CTF challenges, and more. 

Industrial Visit



On 24th February 2025, an industrial visit to the National Institute of Oceanography (NIO) was organized to give students practical exposure to oceanographic research and marine technologies. Mr. Anand explained key areas such as Biological and Geographical Oceanography, and Marine Archaeology. Students also explored the Marine Instrumentation and Ocean Engineering departments, learning about underwater robotics, sensors, and marine structural designs. Informative videos on NIO's research and underwater technologies further deepened their understanding, highlighting the role of computer applications in oceanography.



Introduction to iOS App Development



On 24th February 2025, a guest lecture on iOS App Development was held for IV Semester students, featuring Mr. Shibu from Redington Ltd. and Mr. James from Consolidated Techware (iPlanet Education). Organized by the Department of Computer Science, the session covered industry trends, in-demand skills, and career opportunities in mobile app development, with a focus on iOS. Students were introduced to Swift and Xcode, and a live demo enhanced their practical understanding. Mr. James also highlighted Apple's educational initiatives, including the Swift Curriculum and certification programs. The session provided valuable insights and hands-on exposure, bridging the gap between academics and industry.

Industrial Trip



On 27th February 2025, students visited the Infosys Gachibowli campus in Hyderabad, where they were welcomed by facility managers and given a guided tour of software development units, including a 30-

acre solar panel farm. An interactive session with a project manager covered Infosys' recruitment process, coding skills, and the Hybrid Agile Implementation approach. Students actively engaged in discussions, gaining insights into IT careers and industry expectations. The visit offered valuable exposure to a professional tech environment and inspired students to pursue careers in the software industry.

Placement HR Drive "TALENT CONNECT"



On 28th February 2025, the second round of the Talent Connect campus drive was held at Yenepoya Balmatta campus, focusing on HR interviews for final-year BCA/B.Sc. students who had cleared the initial technical screening conducted on 27th January. Out of 29 registered students, 12 attended the HR round, while the rest could not participate due to internship or project commitments. Talent Connect, associated with 30 companies, will share shortlisted resumes with potential employers. The session, starting at 10:00 AM with one or two HR panelists, was coordinated by Mr. Amith S. Rao, Placement Officer and Assistant Professor, Department of Computer Science.



Computer Networks



From March 3rd to March 6th, 2025, IBM conducted a four-day offline training program for first-year BCA (AI, CC, and DevOps) students, focusing on HTML, CSS, GitHub basics, and OSI Layers. Led by Mr. Shashank, the sessions combined theoretical lectures with hands-on practice, allowing students to build structured web pages, apply styling, and manage code using GitHub in real-world scenarios. With 75 students participating, all in official IBM training shirts, the program provided a strong foundation in web development, version control, and collaborative coding practices, preparing students for future industry projects.

Seminar workshop "Project Based Orientation Program"



On March 3, 2025, an orientation session was conducted at the Balmatta campus to introduce the NASSCOM Digital 101 Certified Course, led by Mr.Ashwin Kature from Quantum Learning. Aimed



Visit to Central Plantation Crop Research Institute



As an environmental gesture, NSS Yenepoya donated ₹500 to support the zoo's animal welfare programs, with the handover witnessed by zoo authorities and NSS officers.

Activities included a guided tour focusing on endangered species, discussions with zoo officials about sustainable animal care, and educational sessions on biodiversity conservation. The program benefited 136 participants (including teachers, students, and community beneficiaries) and fostered ecological awareness, community participation, and strengthened collaboration with local environmental organizations. The experience encouraged volunteers to adopt sustainable practices and reinforced the NSS values of service and environmental stewardship.


the various opportunities available for financial independence, underscoring the impactful role of such initiatives in supporting women's empowerment and sustainable community development.






