AN ESCAPADE

‘A museum is a place where nothing was lost, just rediscovered’- Nanette L. Avery. Final year B.Sc. (Hons.) Forensic Science students along with Ms. Bhavyashree Rai, HOD and Ms. Swati Yadav visited Forensic Science Museum at Roshni Nilaya, School of Social Work on 23 June 2022. The students viewed numerous charts and specimens on display regarding the various branches of Forensic Science. A demonstration on tool mark evidence and its analysis, along with glass fractures was given. Adjacent to it was the Ballistics branch and Toxicology display. The Forensic Anthropology branch where the skull, skeleton and various bones and the determination of age, sex, and race from the same, Questioned Document analysis, Photography and different types of injuries like abrasions, contusions, laceration, incised wounds, stabs were shown. A detailed explanation on the stages of decomposition and preliminary analysis of blood using Benzidine test was given. They also discussed with the students about the confirmatory tests, branches for hair and soil analysis, handling and packing of evidence along with sketching and report writing. A simulated crime scene was presented where it was shown that a husband had killed his wife and hanged himself. It was also a suspected burglary case. The students gained a lot of knowledge in ballistics, injuries, anthropology, crime scene management and other Forensic related branches.

Tobacco is a crop, mostly used for the act of making cigarettes and is easily found anywhere throughout the world. Nicotine is a really harmful and addictive drug that is found in tobacco and is the main cause of many types of illnesses. More than 8 million people die each year from the tobacco epidemic, which is one of the greatest risks to global public health. This figure includes roughly 1.2 million fatalities from exposure to secondhand smoke. There is no level of cigarette exposure that is safe; all kinds of tobacco are toxic. The most prevalent method of tobacco consumption worldwide is cigarette smoking. Other tobacco goods include bidis, kreteks, cigars, cigarillos, roll-your-own tobacco, waterpipe tobacco, and numerous smokeless tobacco items. More than 80% of the 1.3 billion tobacco users globally reside in low- and middle-income nations, which bear the brunt of the disease and death caused by tobacco use. By diverting household spending away from necessities like food and shelter to cigarettes, tobacco usage contributes to poverty.

Why smoking should be banned:

Pollution: Brought on by people smoking cigarettes, who discharge chemicals into the atmosphere.

Cancer: Smokers have a very high risk of developing the disease, but their chances of preventing it immediately increase after they quit.

Addiction: Cigarettes are one of the most addicting and widely available goods in the world today.

Public health: Smokers' second-hand smoke causes harm to non-smokers by raising their risk of developing cancer. Smokers' smoke also causes harm to pets and cats.

Children: Parents who smoke indoors endanger the lives of their kids. Smoking causes the most harm to young bodies because they are still growing and developing, and it also makes parents addicted and causes their kids to follow in their footsteps.

Oral health: Adults already deal with enough dental problems brought on by poor diets, little exercise, ageing, and smoking. Smokers have a restricted amount of space to reside in because not everyone wants to share a home with a smoker.

Conclusion:

Because of the risks to the user's health, which are subsequently transferred to other members of society through social and financial expenses, using tobacco is clearly unhealthy. Individual users cannot easily and voluntarily stop using the substance since it is addictive. Therefore, prohibiting the use of the drug constitutes the most important control approach.

When there is great despair, we ask only of Him,

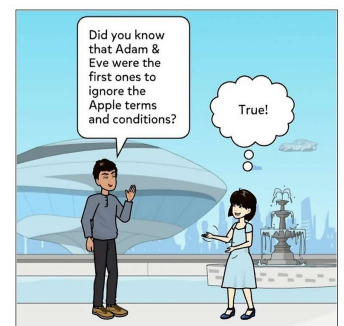
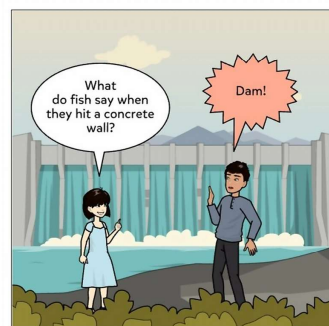
